



AUSTRIA'S NUCLEAR POLICY

- > Advocating a nuclear phase-out Energy Union without nuclear power
- Continuously improving nuclear safety reducing risks
- > Transparency and participation in the nuclear sector
 - **European and international fora, working groups, initiatives, etc.**
 - **Enabling participation of the public concerned in transboundary procedures**
 - Improving communication with national stakeholders



ENABLING PARTICIPATION – LEGAL INSTRUMENTS

- ➤ **Aarhus-Convention** on Access to Information, Public Participation in Decision-making and Access to Justice in Environmental Matters (UNECE), pertinent EU directives respectively
- **Espoo-Convention** on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context (UN-ECE), pertinent EU directives respectively
 - **Public Concerned:** Comments via competent authority, Public Hearing
 - > State: Comments, Public Hearing, Consultations, Monitoring
- Bilateral Agreements
- IAEA Conventions (of limited impact)

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ENABLING PARTICIPATION – TRANSBOUNDARY EIA/SEA PROCEDURES

- ➤ **Participation** whenever adverse transboundary impacts cannot be excluded (deterministically), but "graded-approach"
- > Adverse impacts: if and when any intervention measure is required
- Enabling public (stakeholder) involvement
- **Expert statements, consultations, etc., to**
 - advocate Austrian environmental/safety concerns
 - allow for competent and comprehensive information to public (Federal Environmental Agency website http://www.umweltbundesamt.at/umweltinformation/kernenergie/)

Decommissioning Projects:

> NPP EBO V-1, Slovakia (2006 – 2007) consultation only

➤ NPP KKI-1, Germany (2014 – 2016) full participation (Danube)

➤ NPP KRB-II, Germany (2016 –) full participation (Danube)

National Programmes – Council Directive 2011/70/Euratom

- Neighbouring countries D, H (finished), CZ, I (to come), SK, SLO (no procedure)
- > NEP (Nationales Entsorgungsprogramm) in Austria
- **EBRD** administered funds: BIDSF, IIDSF, KIDSF

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TRANSPARENCY AND PARTICIPATION IN THE NUCLEAR SECTOR

Opportunities:

- > Interested stakeholders
- Developing legal framework
- Stress tests, Topical Peer review

Limitations:

- Limited resources/time
- Different levels of knowledge and competence
- Security/Confidentiality
- Language

General Issues:

- Socio-cultural context
- Early participation/project well developed
